If you were forced from your home as a result of the hurricanes, demand your rights!



When disaster strikes, you deserve to have your basic human rights protected!

You are in your own country and not a “refugee.”

Your rights as an INTERNALLY DISPLACED PERSON are recognized by the United Nations



If you had to leave your home because of Hurricane Katrina...

You have a human right to:

- Stable housing
- Education for your children
- Food, clothes & water
- Information about health, safety and your home
- An opportunity to participate in decisions about rebuilding

If you are sick, wounded, pregnant, elderly or have special needs, you deserve:

- Quick medical care
- Trauma counseling and therapy
- Reproductive health care



You and your family’s basic human rights should be protected!

- If you were separated, the Government should help you get back together
- The Government should tell you about any search for missing family members

If a family member died in Hurricane Katrina:

- You have a human right to claim their body
- If they have been buried, you have the right to access the site of burial

Internally displaced persons have a human right to live with dignity and security!

Government agencies are responsible for assisting you in securing a stable and safe living situation whether you choose to return home or relocate.

They should also help you:

- Get back property or receive compensation
- Reclaim vital information and possessions or get adequate compensation
